



BOWLKER, Charles **The Art of Angling; or Compleat Fly-Fisher: Describing the Different Kinds of Fish, Their Haunts, Places of Feeding, and Retirement, with an account of the Generation of Fishes, and Observations on the breeding of carp, together with directions how to regulate pools or ponds. Also Various kinds of baits. flies. directions for making artificial flies. Illustrated with many new improvements in the Art of Angling.**

Sixth Edition of a popular angling handbook that went through many editions far into the 19th century. Charles Bowlker's father Richard wrote the text for the first two editions (Worcester [1758?] and London 1766) but Charles reworked his father's handbook for the 1774 edition. "This was the standard textbook of the late eighteenth and early nineteenth century... Charles was considered the most finished fly-fisher of his day. For such a small volume it is very wide-ranging, with more advice on the choice of tackle than on tactics, and with much of the material taken from seventeenth century writers. It is an important milestone in popular angling literature" (Westwood/Satchell).


Frederic M. Halford (1844-1914), author and angler of the late Victorian and early Edwardian eras whose writings and systematic approach to the dry fly profoundly influenced fly-fishing around the world. His books, beginning with Floating Flies (1886) and Dry-Fly Fishing in Theory and Practice (1889), and culminating with Dry-Fly Entomology (1897), made a legendary figure of the somewhat reserved Halford and shaped the sport for decades. As Tony Hayter's recent biography demonstrates, Halford's life and writings remain of perennial interest.





#### 8. WALTON, Izaak. The Complete Angler.

The first Pickering edition of Walton's classic; printed in diamond type by Thomas White, Johnson's Court. One of the most desirable of Pickering's Diamond Classics. Engraved frontispiece and title page, with woodcuts of fishes in the text.

48mo (60 x 100 mm), pp. [iii]-314, [4]. In original cloth with paper spine label. Label with small chip, browned and slightly rubbed. With bookseller's ticket of Slatter & Rose Oxford. A little slight sunning to boards, a little browning to free endpapers, otherwise a very good, partially unopened, copy.

One of the most desirable of Pickering's Diamond Classics. William Pickering began his career as a bookseller and then turned to publishing in the late 1810s. In 1821 he began issuing the popular series of "Diamond Classics," miniature books set in tiny 4.5 point type and offered in a cloth or leather binding at an affordable price of six shillings. The series continued through 1831. Pickering was also one of the early protagonists of using cloth (as here) for binding his books.





Colquhoun was a keen sportsman and an accurate observer of nature, and during his long life he acquired an experience in matters of sport and natural history that was quite exceptional, for the summer quarters were changed almost every year, and the list of places rented by him embraces nearly every district of Scotland, so that his opportunities for observation were especially favourable. In 1840, he embodied his experiences in The Moor and the Loch, which speedily took a high rank among books on Scottish sport.




